Brief Overview

Nutley Hall is a living and working **community** providing residential care & support (plus day-care) for 33 residents, and employs nearly 50 members of staff, many of them also resident. It is a registered care **home** for adults with learning disabilities, with a **craft centre** and a lively **cultural & social** environment.

Nutley Hall is a non profit-making company, registered as a **charity** with the Charity Commissioners (no. 307023), and with the Care Quality Commission (**CQC**).

The Main House has the Phoenix & Ashdown View households and there are four other residential **houses**.

The work takes place in on-site workshops:

the Bakery; the Weavery;

Woodwork; Candle & Basket-making;

the Kitchen, the Laundry

and the Garden & Grounds - & Ashdown Forest.

There are also adult **education** classes, movement, music and drama, and many social and cultural **activities**, some of them – like horse-riding and swimming – outside Nutley Hall.

The community meeting centre and theatre is a specially designed hall known as "Orchard House".

Nutley Hall is situated on the main A22 London to Eastbourne road in the centre of the **village** of Nutley, five miles north of Uckfield in East Sussex.

The lanes on each side of Nutley Hall lead down directly onto **Ashdown Forest**, where residents can enjoy walking.

Nutley Hall is home to people with a range of learning disabilities at different levels of need, and residents usually choose to stay a **long time**, often seeing Nutley Hall as their home.

Residents, both men and women, vary in age from the twenties to the eighties.
